Crime Prevention Tips

Hyde Park neighborhoods have been involved in community policing initiatives since their inception in Kansas City in the 1980s. Monthly neighborhood crime and safety meetings are held on the last Thursday of the month from January through October. Meetings are held at 7pm at KCPD Central Patrol Station's Community Room located at 1200 E. Linwood. Neighbors and businesses are also invited to become involved with the WatchKC program by registering the location of video surveillance cameras on their properties. Participation is voluntary, and police will not have access to footage without your knowledge. Registered camera locations are mapped to help detectives to find footage to assist them in solving cases. Visit kcmo.gov/police/watchkc to register or find out more.

The following tips are preventative strategies that can be implemented to decrease the risk of crime. Some are simple changes that can help you avoid becoming a victim. Thank you to the Jackson County Sherriff's Department and the Kansas City Police Department for many of these tips.

- Keep your porch light on at night and consider motion activated lights around your home. Trim trees and bushes that block views of your doors or windows. Darkness and obstructed views allow intruders the opportunity to enter homes unnoticed. Thieves are less likely to attempt entry where houses are well lit and they are more likely to be noticed.
- Make sure doors and windows are closed and locked. Check to see if frames are loose and need to be adjusted to avoid being easily forced open. Do not open doors to anyone you do not know or trust.
- **Pay attention to your surroundings.** Avoid being distracted while walking or sitting in your car. Save texting or phone calls for when you get home.
- Lock your car, even when refueling at the gas station or running quick errands. Leave your car empty and keep valuables out of sight, even small amounts of change. Hide charging cables & cords, which may be a sign you have additional items of value in the car.
- Avoid package theft. Ask to have items sent to a neighbor or your workplace if you know you won't be home at the time of delivery.

- When going out of town, have a neighbor to collect your mail, or ask the post office and newspaper to delay delivery until your return. Ask neighbors to keep an eye on your house. Leave on the radio or TV, and put lights on a timer. Unattended mail and a quiet, dark house make an easy target.
- Get to know your neighbors. Knowing the people in your neighborhood will help you to notice when there is unusual activity. Getting contact information from those on your block will give you a way to reach out if you notice something suspicious on another neighbor's property.



Hyde Park Remembers Ginny Johnson

Hyde Park will miss our neighbor Virginia "Ginny" Johnson who we lost on March 30, 2018. She was a self-described 'old hippie' with a droll and dry sense of humor used to comment with pragmatic and witty accuracy on the world and its inhabitants. Ginny retired from her original career as a nurse and became a self-trained media artist showing in galleries in Kansas



City, Parkville, and Overland Park. She was also instrumental in the founding and administration of the Kansas City Free Health Clinic.

Long time Hyde Parkers will be most familiar with Ginny's neighborhood activism. She was a

member of the South Hyde Park planning committee, a group whose written plan ultimately resulted in the neighborhood's listing on the local Historic Registry. Ginny also focused her time on crime prevention and was responsible for originating and maintaining the Hyde Park email list until Facebook became ubiquitous enough that it was no longer necessary. In addition, she was actively involved in the implementation of community policing in all three Hyde Park area neighborhoods, an initiative which later evolved into our current monthly crime meetings.

The recent memorial for Ginny was a true celebration of a well lived life, and full of stories from family and

friends about her love of music and travel. Neighbor David Zagalik recounts, "Our neighborhood would not be the amazing place [it is] to raise a family if it wasn't for Ginny and many others who refused to run away from crime." We are thankful for her varied contributions throughout the years and she will be remembered by her many neighbors and friends in Hyde Park.

Community Spotlight: DEED Foundation

The historic Delta Athenaeum, located at 900 E. Linwood Boulevard, is home to the Foundation for Delta Educational and Economic Development (DEED) and the Kansas City Missouri Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Delta Sigma Theta is a service-oriented sorority and the DEED Foundation was established in 1998 by members of the Kansas City, Missouri Alumnae Chapter. At a monthly neighborhood meeting earlier this year, DEED president Lisa Hardwick gave an update on plans for the Athenaeum and development of nearby lots. They plan to improve the surrounding area for increased event parking and the future development of 12-unit residential buildings for teacher and artist housing.

In partnership with the Delta Chapter, the DEED Foundation hosts several annual and ongoing programs that support their focus on educational and economic development, including the Women of Courage Awards, mentoring sessions for middle and high school students, and The Cotillion, a program held for the last three decades that is "designed to enhance the academic, social, cultural, and civic awareness of selected high school seniors from the greater Kansas City metropolitan area." Over \$72,000 in scholarships were awarded to Cotillion participants last year.

Constructed in 1914, the Delta Athenaeum features Grecian architecture, parlor rooms, a ballroom, and a barrel-vaulted music room originally commissioned as a concert hall. Available for events and meetings, rental information and reservation requests are available through the DEED website. Charitable donations to support the DEED Foundation's programs, as well as the historic preservation of the Athenaeum, are welcome and can be made online.
