KCPS School Board Election Boundaries Redrawn

In June, the Kansas City Election Board announced five new sub-district boundaries for Kansas City Public School board elections. The current board is made up of members representing six sub-districts and three at-large members. The election in April 2019 will decide the new board, which will include members representing five sub-districts and two at-large members. Election boundaries were redrawn to bring our district into compliance with Missouri legislation and align with the governance of most other school boards throughout the state. Hyde Park neighbors living north of 39th Street will be represented by the school board member from sub-district 2, and neighbors living south of 39th Street will be represented by sub-district 4.

Project Lead Safe KC

Many historic homes feature beautiful architecture and lots of charm, but older homes can also come with challenges like lead paint. Project Lead Safe Kansas City is a grant funded program that can assist residents with lead-based paint stabilization. A licensed lead inspector can come to your home to determine what the lead hazards are and to make work recommendations. Licensed lead abatement contractors perform the remediation. Types of work include specialized cleaning, wet scraping and repainting, encapsulation or enclosure, and window replacement. If you own your home, you may qualify for assistance under this program if you:

- Own and occupy a home in Kansas City that was built before 1978
- Your household income is less than 80% of the area's median income
- You have a child under the 6 years of age who lives in your home or visits your home more than 10 hours every week

"It's definitely worth putting in the application," said neighbor Lisa Gooden. "We were on the waiting list for a long time, but then we got a call and were very fortunate to receive replacement windows and new exterior paint."

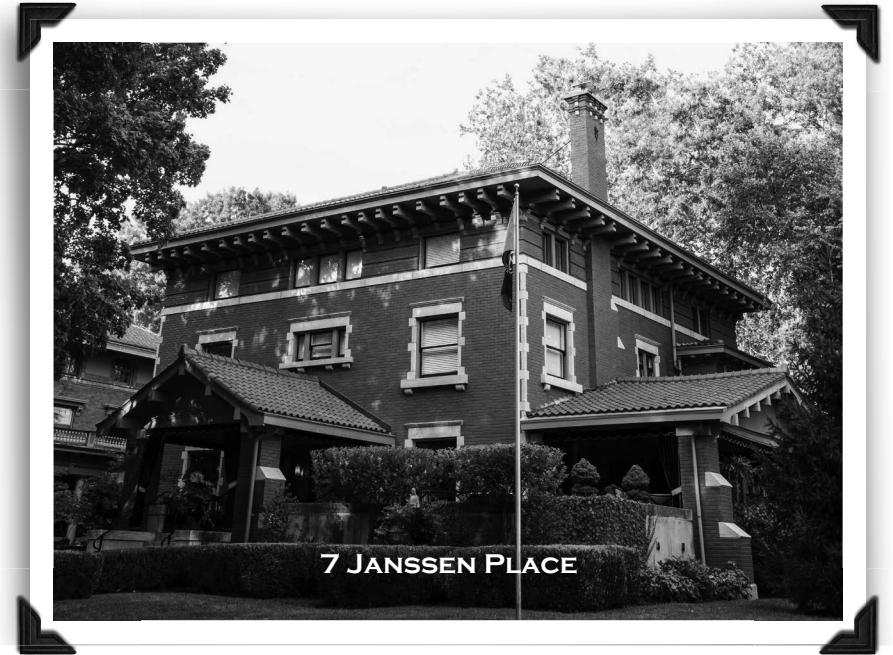
33rd Hyde Park Historic Homes Tour

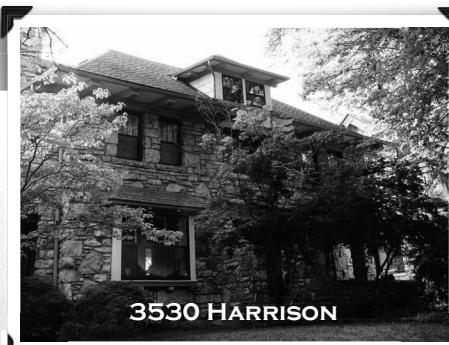

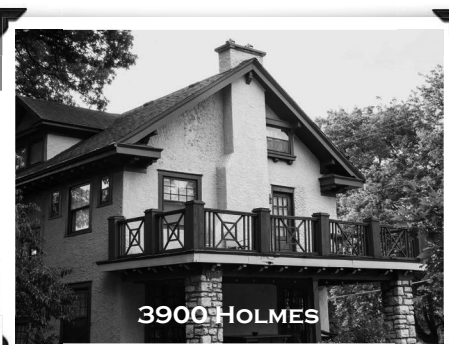

Streetcar Election

Voters overwhelmingly approved the streetcar expansion in results certified June 20. Votes were submitted by mail-in ballot with 75% of votes cast in favor of a special sales tax and property taxes to support expanding the streetcar line to UMKC. Property owners living near the Transportation Development District (TDD) will receive an additional 25-year property tax assessment. In addition, the TDD board is authorized to collect a 1% sales tax over the next 30 years. Funds collected will maintain the current streetcar line as well as support the expansion. Completion of the \$227 million project is projected for 2023.
