Update: Gillham Road Improvement Project

In 2003, the neighborhoods surrounding Hyde and Gillham Parks worked together to develop recommendations for improvements to the two parks. This work resulted in the Gillham Road Improvement Project (GRIP) which included results from neighborhood surveys, design charrettes, and park walks. The Gillham Park Masterplan was developed by KC Parks with the results from this project. To date the following masterplan improvements have been completed:

- Build of Play Area 2-5 years at 38th
- Tennis court improvements at 39th
- Build of Play Area 2-12 years at 41st
- Spray Ground at 41st
- Pedestrian Trail along Kenwood
- Removal of Swimming Pool Restrooms
- Improvements to Lower Pedestrian Trails 42nd to Brush Creek
- Addition to Pedestrian Trails 36th to 38th

In the spring of 2018, the Hyde Park Neighborhood Association polled its members on the improvements yet to be done to develop a list of priorities for future Public Improvements Advisory Committee (PIAC) funding. The top three improvements were:

- Pedestrian Lighting along Lower Pedestrian Trails 36th to 38th and 42nd to Brush Creek (PIAC - 7835)
- Upper Pedestrian Trail Restoration 43rd to 45th (PIAC - 7836)
- Trellis and Picnic Area between Play Area and Spray Ground (PIAC - 7837)

HPNA Board members continue to advocate for these improvements and appreciate your support and feedback on these and other priorities.

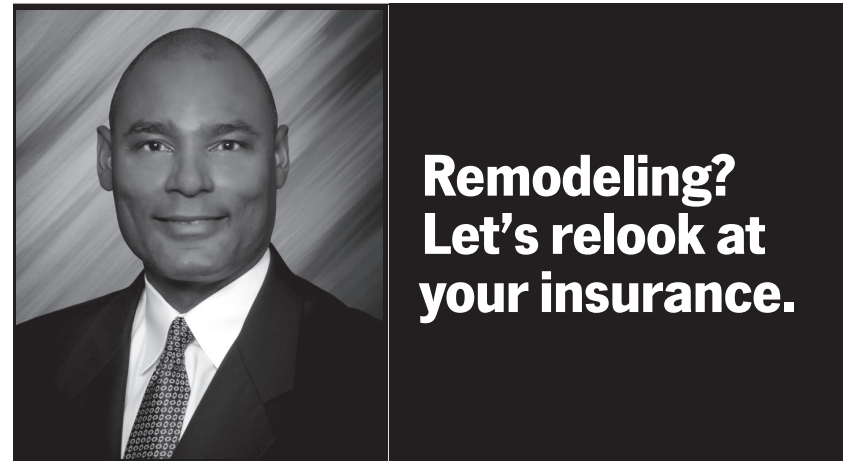

Don't Miss Leaf & Brush Pickup

Curbside collection for leaf and brush this spring will be April 15 - April 19 on your regularly scheduled trash day.

Curbside collection will take place on your regularly scheduled trash day.

- No more than 20 sacks & bundles per household.
- Paper lawn debris sacks only, no plastic bags.
- No grass clippings or trash allowed in sacks.
- Branches must be bundled and 3 inches or less in diameter.
- Bundles must 2 feet or less in diameter and no more than 4 feet long.
- If wet weather is forecast, cover sacks and bundles with clear plastic.

Curbside Recycling Tips.

Curbside recycling happens once a week on our regularly scheduled trash day. In order to recycle at the curb, you must use a blue or black recycling bin from participating Westlake Hardware or Price Chopper stores. Bins are \$9 each. More than one bin may be used, or set extra recyclables in cardboard boxes, paper bags, or plastic tubs next to your bin. Prior to recycling, remove all food and rinse containers. These lists will give you an idea on what can and can't be recycled at the curb. For a more complete list, visit: kcmo.gov/neighborhoods/trash/curbside-recycling.

Items you can recycle curbside:

- Office paper, junk mail, newspapers and magazines

- Corrugated cardboard
- Carrier stock and chipboard (i.e. cardboard soft drink, beer cartons, cereal and shoe boxes)
- Paper/hardback books
- Plastic bottles with a neck #1 and #2, such as water and soda bottles, milk jugs and detergent bottles. Reattached lids may now be recycled, too.
- Plastic containers #3 thru #7, such as yogurt and margarine/ butter tub containers
- Cardboard egg cartons
- Pizza boxes (No food)
- Shredded paper (in paper bags)
- Aluminum cans and other metal cans
- Clamshells (Deli or salad bar containers)
- Aseptic containers (milk, juice and vegetable cartons)

- Clean aluminum foil and foil pans

Items you cannot recycle curbside:

- Plastic bags
- Styrofoam, including Styrofoam egg cartons
- Motor oil bottles and other automotive product bottles
- Containers for household hazardous material
- Paper towels, tissues or napkins, plates or cups
- Gift wrap
- Photographs, blueprints and hanging file folders
- Bags that contained pet food, fertilizer, charcoal or kitty litter
- Metal pots
- Glass (For a monthly fee, residents may contract with outside companies to recycle glass curbside)
