New Banners Coming to Hyde Park

Ten talented Hvde Parkers ubmitted designs for a new banner to be displayed on light poles throughout Hyde Park, making for a very difficult **decision.** The design selected by the Board of Directors was submitted by Lee Ernst. Lee, a

33-year resident of Hyde Park, worked for many years as a graphic designer at Hallmark Cards designing seasonal retail displays and window banners. He now works as a graphic designer at The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art where he designs graphics for exhibitions, including the banners you see around the Museum.

The Board is getting proposals for production and installation, and working with the City to designate poles for the banners throughout Hyde Park. The banners are expected to be installed in the next 60 days.

Enrollment Begins for 2020-2021 School Year

There are many public school options choose from and research from 2017 indicates most Kansas City families get information about school choices from their social and community networks and from touring schools. Now that enrollment has begun for the 2020–2021 school year, keep in mind that limiting your search to only those schools where you know families already enrolled can be a contributing factor to school segregation and inequitable education in our city. It's important to look beyond our own networks when considering which schools to attend, and to tour schools that enroll students with backgrounds that are different from your own.

According to a recent analysis of Kansas City schools, segregation by race and economic status is increasing in K.C. schools. In 2017, 39% of public schools (district + charter) were intensively segregated, compared to 12% in 2009 and 9% in 1999. And while white students make up only 10% of public school enrollment in Kansas City, 47% of those students are enrolling in 1 of 7 schools. Integrated schools have benefits for all students, including increased academic achievement for students of color, increased empathy, and reduced prejudice and stereotyping. All students benefit from the critical thinking skills and cross-cultural collaboration that come with a diverse learning environment.

The three neighborhood schools for Hyde Park families are Longfellow Elementary, Central Middle School, and Central High School. Signature school options provide programs focused on a specific theme such as arts, language, IB, African Centered, or Montessori. These schools enroll on a first come first serve basis, and may have screenings, auditions, or testing requirements. Enrollment for these schools can be completed at EnrollKC.org or at the KCPS Board of Education offices at 2901 Troost. If Signature schools receive more applications than they have spaces available, additional interested students will be put on a waitlist. *Applications for signature programs should be* completed by February 14.

Charter schools are public schools governed independently from the school district. Many charter schools or networks have partnered together to use a common enrollment application that is available at SchoolAppKC.org. Applications for other charter schools may be found on individual school websites or in person at the schools. Charter schools that receive more applications than they have spaces available will have an admissions lottery and additional interested students will be put on a waitlist. Applications through SchoolAppKC are due March 2.



Kansas City Artists Coalition Relocates to Hyde Park


