

Land Acknowledgement

Hyde Park currently occupies land that was once the home of native tribes including the Kaw (People of the **South Wind).** The Kaw (or Kanza) were part of a larger Dhegiha-Siouan language speaking group that migrated from the Ohio Valley area. Between the years 400-500, Dhegiha-Siouan tribes migrated up through the central Mississippi River Valley and settled in the area now known as St. Louis. After many centuries, some tribes separated and migrated up river and others down river. The Kaw and Osage traveled up the Missouri River between 1200-1250 during the Middle Mississippian period. The Kaw settled on land that is now the north and eastern parts of Kansas and the Kansas City area.

From the mid-1700s to the late 1800s, the Kaw were decimated by treaties with the United States government, forced relocations, disease and conflict with European settlers. They once lived on 20-million acres of land across northern Kansas and Missouri, but their homelands were taken and their people moved many times until a federal act in 1872 forced their removal from Kansas entirely and onto a 100,000-acre reservation in Oklahoma.

The Kaw Nation currently has over 3,500 members living all over the United States. The Kaw Nation is based in Kaw City, Oklahoma and Lynn Williams is the Tribal Council Chair. The site of the last Kaw village in Kansas, near what is now Council Grove, has been placed on the National Register of Historic Places and is being restored as Allegawaho Memorial Heritage Park to tell the story of the

Kanza. The tribe oversees housing developments, a health and wellness center, the SouthWind Casino, and many more programs and businesses in Kay County, Oklahoma. They are also actively working to preserve their native language through classes for children as well as weekly conversation groups. Maude McCauley Clark Rowe, one of the last fluent Kanza speakers, worked extensively with Professor Robert L. Rankin from the University of Kansas to document and preserve the language. The Kaw Nation sponsors Powwows during Council Grove's annual Washunga Days and the


